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How can I find courses offered at the KUG?

There are three ways to look up the KUG's course offerings, as explained below:

1. To find KUG-courses, which you choose to fill in your Learning Agreement go to <https://online.kug.ac.at/KUGonline/webnav.ini> . Scroll to the bottom of the column on the left side of the page and click the menu option „Studium“. Then, click „Studienrichtungen“. In the “Studienrichtungen” Menu, click on the appropriate Study Field. In the upper right corner of each Study Field page, you may click on „Studienplanansicht“ (Curriculum View), which can also be viewed in English. Clicking on an individual course will open a new window with information on the type of course, the instructor, and during which semester the course will be offered.

For even more specific information on a course: in the new window, click again on the title of the course at the top of the page (this is the most current course offering). This will open up a third window with more details including a course summary, course goals, exam dates, etc.

2. If you are looking for a specific course that does not appear in the „Studienplanansicht“/Curriculum View, try returning to the page <https://online.kug.ac.at/KUGonline/webnav.ini> . Click on the drop-down „Suche“ (Search) Menu, and then scroll down to „Lehrveranstaltung“. You can also complete searches in English.

3. If you want to take a course with a specific professor, you can also search on the same webpage - <https://online.kug.ac.at/KUGonline/webnav.ini> – by clicking on the drop-down „Suche“ (Search) Menu, and scrolling down to „Bedienstete.“ Type in the professor's last name, and hit enter. When the desired professor's name is found, clicking on his/her name will cause a new window to open with the professor's „Visitenkarte“ (virtual business card). Finally, click on „Lehrveranstaltungen“ to see a list of that professor's course offerings.

Types of Courses

Lecture

Courses which serve to demonstrate and communicate artistic and scientific information as well as scientific fundamentals and specialised knowledge. They are held in the form of a lecture. The exam will take place in one sitting, and can be written, oral or both.

Proseminar

Courses in which theoretical and/or scientific-practical skills and abilities are taught in the context of artistic-scientific professional qualifications with occasional active involvement of the student.

Seminar

Courses in which theoretical and/or scientific-practical skills and abilities are taught in the context of artistic-scientific professional qualifications. This includes the active inclusion of the student, i.e. participation in critical discussion and/or written work, and/or oral presentations. Subject specific discourse and argumentative method is introduced.

Practical Courses

Courses with a practical teaching content, in which small practical artistic or scientific projects are carried out with consideration for all necessary aspects of the course. Practical courses can also be taken outside of the university concerned.

Practical Exercise

Courses in which practical skills are taught in an artistic and artistic-scientific context, which are geared towards professional qualifications.

Individual Artistic Lessons

Courses which serve to develop the individual artistic skills of the student as well as communicate technical artistic skills to them. The director of the course may decide whether to partially carry out this course as a group lesson, if the teaching content or the practical method necessitates this.

(The required number of hours for individual student lessons may only be reduced in the organisation of group lessons on a pro-rata basis. Recital hours, concerts and artistic presentations are required for the successful completion of this particular course.)

Lecture with Practical Exercise

Courses which serve to demonstrate and communicate artistic and scientific information as well as scientific fundamentals and specialised knowledge. At the same time, practical skills are taught in an artistic and artistic-scientific context, which are geared towards professional qualifications.

Group Artistic Lessons

Courses which serve to develop the individual artistic skills of the student as well as communicate technical artistic skills to them.

Recital hours, concerts and artistic presentations are required for the successful completion of this particular course.



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Important Information:

In several Study Fields (i.e. Instrumental Studies, Voice, Conducting, and Composition), foreign exchange students receive one-on-one instruction (KE) in their primary artistic field only. In addition, exchange students generally may enroll in lecture courses („Vorlesungen“/VO). Because the number of student places in seminars („Seminaren“/SE) and professional study courses (UE, VU, PR) is limited, you should contact the instructors directly to ask about any available spaces.
