

Recognition Regulation at KUG
(Decision by the Study Commission on 9 June 2009,
approved in the Senate Meeting on 16 June 2009)

§ 1 (1) In general, applications for the recognition of examinations must be made at the latest in the penultimate semester of a study program and/or stage of study. Also in cases where the study duration has been shortened (regulation concerning courses in the main artistic subject according to § 55 Satzung KUG), the request for recognition of study achievement must be made at the latest 6 months before the date of the exam that ends the studies and/or the stage of study.

(2) Concerning applications for the recognition of examinations that were taken in the last semester of a stage of study and/or study program within another degree program, there is (contrary to Abs. 1) a processing period of 2 months.

§ 2 (1) Courses in the main artistic subjects (ZKF) are generally not recognized in the fields of Voice, IGP (Music Education-Voice and Instruments), Instrumental Studies and Jazz. Students who have already completed a part of their studies at other universities, or whose success allows them to expect an early termination of their studies, can apply to the Dean of Studies to have their study period shortened (regulation concerning courses in the main artistic subject according to § 55 Satzung KUG). These applications require a written statement from the instructor in the main artistic subject if the study period is to be shortened by 50%, and a detailed expertise from the instructor in the main artistic subject if the study period is to be shortened by 75%. Shortening the length of study period by more than 75% is not allowed.

(2) Courses in **Orchestra, Big Band and Jazz Choir** will not be recognized except where credits are necessary because of a shortened duration of studies. Also in the case of a shortening of the study duration, courses can only be recognized if they have been passed at approved postsecondary educational institutions (according to § 78 Abs. 1 UG 2002). Recognition of orchestral activities outside of the study program (e.g. in professional orchestras) is not possible.

(3) A course in Choir will not be recognized unless it has been taken as part of a study program at an approved educational institute (according to § 78 Abs. 1 UG 2002). (This means that taking part in opera productions at an opera house, CD productions, private choir productions, etc. will not be recognized.)

(4) A course in chamber music will not be recognized unless it has been taken as part of a study program at an approved educational institute (according to § 78 Abs. 1 UG 2002). (This means that taking part in chamber music concerts at festivals, CD productions involving chamber music, or other concert activities in the area of chamber music will not be recognized.)

§ 3 The recognition of free electives remains unaffected by this rule.
